News from The Shed: At long last work on construction of the main shed has begun! I'm sure there are some big smiles on the dials of those who, after some frustration over lack of funding, satisfying council requirements, followed by delay with the excavation work partly due to inclement weather, council having to reschedule its work priorities, and just when the concrete work would proceed, can finally breathe a sigh of relief! Our much-needed grant was finally approved and, while it wasn't quite as much as we had hoped for, will go a long way to achieving our goal. Kingborough Council also came to our assistance with site preparation and certain fees.

Several of you would know that this project has been on the drawing board for some time, and with membership having grown, the additional space will be most welcome - not to mention that additional equipment which has been taking up much-needed space in one particular member's garage, will finally be relocated to its new home.

It wasn't easy, as rain threatened to wash everything away, mud caked boots and shoes, and tempers were slightly frayed at times until a layer of heavy gravel was laid, and peace reigned once more!







5th & 6th Nov.:Drainage had to be allowed for, and boxing of the foundation prior to the concrete being poured.

11th Nov.:There were concerns the contractor dealing with the concrete might not be available - spring rain was impacting on him too.

A few dedicated members chose to do night patrol of the work site as a deterrent to uninvited visitors! It was mentioned that they tucked into a couple of pizzas, with one member feeling the heat due to a check up on his diabetes scheduled shortly!

On Monday 18th November 2013, the rain cleared temporarily, enabling the foundation (concrete supplied by Hazell Bros. at a generous discount) to be poured. On Friday 22nd November the boxing was removed. A group got together on Monday 25th, creating a temporary heavy-duty gravel path allowing everyone to access The Shed with clean feet! And two taxis were able to deliver their clients virtually to the door by driving onto the now solid foundation. On the 2nd and 3rd December, sunshine allowed a hardworking group to lay ag-drain and blue metal round the parameters of the foundation to assist drainage of water from the embankment.

The next phase (construction of the shed extension) scheduled to commence on Monday, 9th December was put back (bloody rain!) and it appears delivery of materials will commence on Thursday 12th, with (fingers crossed) construction to begin the following day! With some luck (and the weather) the basic structure **might** be ready before Christmas!!??? Anyone want to play Santa?

Fundraising: an on-going activity







Members (like Dave & Kevin) braved the elements selling tickets for our Christmas raffle outside Coles, Kingston on 21st & 22nd November. Others sold to friends and family. All up around \$800 was raised. Members produce chopping boards, bowls, clocks, tables and other items

to sell and use for raffle prizes, small community projects such as garden beds and

sale of unwanted items taking up space in The Shed. As a result of past efforts, some \$4500 has been set aside towards costs for the extension.
